



One-Yard Challenge Rules

Everyone will start with 1 yard of fabric. When the music stops, you will rip the fabric in your possession at that time in half. You will keep $\frac{1}{2}$ yard piece, the other will be passed to the right when the music starts again. When the music stops, you will rip the new half yard piece...keeping the $\frac{1}{4}$ yard and passing $\frac{1}{4}$ yard when the music starts again. When the music stops, rip the $\frac{1}{4}$ yard in half. When the music starts again, keep $\frac{1}{8}$ yard and pass the other $\frac{1}{8}$ yard piece. When the music stops again, you will keep the final piece.

At the end of the music, you will have 1 yard of fabric – 4 pieces – $\frac{1}{2}$ yard, $\frac{1}{4}$ yard, 2- $\frac{1}{8}$ yard pieces.

At this point, you MAY “even” trade your fabric ($\frac{1}{4}$ yard for $\frac{1}{4}$ yard, $\frac{1}{8}$ yard for $\frac{1}{8}$ yard, etc.) with any willing member. There is no limit on the number of trades you can make. You just can’t trade for the fabric to match what you have.

The Challenge will be to use the fabric creatively to make some sort of project. You may add fabric to what you have, but at least 50% of each piece needs to be used in the project, in some manner. The fabric may be embellished, dyed, or manipulated in any way you like.
